Member News: It is with great sadness we



2023 CLC GRAND NATIONAL (Part 6) Russell's Travel Center & Museum

While tracing the old Route 66 to Albuquerque (now I-40) for the 2023 CLC Grand National show, a couple of hungry, weary travelers and a similarly hungry-for-fuel Malibu, searched for temporary refuge for a recharge. Much like seeking a green Oasis in the hot desert sands, in this case the hot, desolate, rough, and rocky terrain of West Texas and eastern New Mexico.

Our wish came true, no, not a mirage, but a real brick and mortar structure, perched upon a small craggy hill (mesa to some), and yes, gas pumps, fuel for our buggy. Welcome relief—no "beware of snakes" signs were posted—but never let your guard down, snakes are everywhere.

The name of this retreat is Russell's. Having all the provisions to fill our tummies, relieve our bladders, and reward us with a special treat, a museum with an eclectic collection of cars, trucks, toys, and petroliana memorabilia. It got better; admission was free.

Entering this wonderland of yesteryear, stepping over the threshold onto the highly-polished, but creaky, wood floor, felt like it was the 1900s again.

Greeting one at the entrance was a familiar character from Star Wars, Yoda, a Jedi with pointy ears, wearing mechanic's white overalls and a Sinclair gasoline cap. Hope it was high-octane gas he was selling for those "Rocket 88" Oldsmobiles.



The theme quickly shifted to the nifty-fifties, featuring a pink '57 T-Bird, and who else, other

than a life-size mannequin of Marilyn, wearing that iconic white dress from the 1955 movie *The Seven-Year Itch*. I even caught her posing with the dress blowing upward as she walked over a New York subway grate to keep cool.



Across the road (aisle) was the king himself, Elvis, with guitar in hand, hips swiveling, posing next to his robin egg-blue '58 Impala convertible, sporting fender skirts and dual antennas.

A promenade of 1950s cars included a mint green '53 Chevy, two '56 Mercury Montclairs, both 2-tone red-and-white, one a 2-door hardtop and the other a 4-door hardtop phaeton. Joining the party was a seldom seen 1954 Pontiac Star Chief convertible in warbonnet red, full fender skirts and amber Indian-





head hood ornament that illuminated at night when the lights are on.



No disappointments for the truck enthusiast. How about a '55 Chevy Cameo 3100 in polar white and bright red trim. Keeping it company was a stepside (also known as a flareside) '67 to '72 Chevy pickup in black and white and a vintage post-war Chevy 3100 stake bed pickup in red.



Other models on display included, but were not limited to, an early Mustang convertible, raven black, white upholstery, with a white stuffed polar bear for companionship. Early Corvettes were nicely represented starting with a '55 and ending with early '70s models. They even included an orange Carmen Ghia for color.



The olden-days were represented with life-size horses (stuffed), one pulling a vintage Texaco Crystalite Kerosene tank wagon.



I had to look twice who was as to driving. A life-size old timer, dressed in jeans, held up with red suspenders, work plaid shirt, Texaco gas cap, and sprouting а long gray beard. Does this remind anyone of a current club member who looks similar to this old truck driver? I'll let you solve the puzzle.



A more "modern" transport mode was Henry's Model TT Ford gas-oline truck—old but functional.

Who said there was privacy in a privy? This diorama of an old prospector had none. He patronized this one-holer' outhouse with everyone in view.



Taking years to collect all these treasures, it would take more than one visit to absorb all of the history represented. With collectibles for all ages, adults adored the full-size cars and trucks and the extensive collection of scale models in most all colors, configurations, and manufacturers. For the younger crowd there were pedal cars, Radio Flyer wagons, and tricycles with real bells and whistles.



Additional collectibles were movie paraphernalia for Elvis, Marilyn, John Wayne, Roy Rogers, and Gene Autry. Petroliana products from Texaco and Sinclair—gas pumps, neon signs, and shelves of motor oil cans—were abundant.



Vintage Coke dispensers and coolers, Camel and Lucky Strike cigarette vending machines, a red-and -white-striped barber pole with barber chair, and a Ford wall clock, with models representing the new color selections for 1949, were all displayed.







This was a truly pleasant, unexpected, and memorable stopover. I do hope it's around for future generations traveling old Route 66 to enjoy. Happy motoring!

Having viewed our first total solar eclipse in 2017, Cindy and I decided to view this month's total solar eclipse. On the morning of April 8th we traveled to Jackson, MO, (just north-west of Cape Girardeau), in the center of the path of totality.


A normal ~2 hour drive took 3 hours. And the trip home? Horrendous! As you saw on the news, traffic after the eclipse returning to St. Louis was a nightmare. Our return trip was 6 hours, but for many it was 8+ hours.

Was 9 hours on the road worthwhile for 4 minutes of solar eclipse totality? For us, YES! It was truly spectacular, a now twice-in-a-lifetime experience. We saw many out-of-state license plates, from as far away as Washington state.

The next total eclipse near St. Louis will be in 2045, sweeping over Oklahoma and Arkansas. And

that eclipse will have a maximum time of totality of 6 minutes.





Partial eclipse above-left, totality above-right. The sun's corona is visible; the "divot" at the bottom is the moon's uneven surface creating a "Baily's bead".
























