SMALL CADDIES FOR BIG DADDIES

It has been said, the difference between men and boys is the price of their toys. I guess a solution is to purchase one just like the real one, only smaller. Yes, scale model cars and trucks have an avid fan club for anyone with a passion for the automobile. Whether it be diecast, resin, plastic, rubber, or tin, all have a "garage space" waiting for the next collector's treasure.

Most popular and collected scales range from a 1/64 diecast (Matchbox, Hot Wheels), 1/43 (Dinky, Corgi), 1/32 (Ertl, Signature), 1/24 (Johan, friction and dealer promos) to 1/18 size (Maisto, Road Signature, Ertl).

Focusing on the 1/43 scale model Cadillacs, the following manufactures, lesser known in the USA, are mostly European, exception being BFCC of China.

BFCC produces a nice diecast 1941 Cadillac 60 Special at a reasonable price (very much like Dinky of old), but with upgraded features of chrome plated bumpers, detailed badging, plastic windows and authentic 1941 paint colors of Fair Oaks green over El Centro green metallic. Other variations come in two-tone silver and maroon, silver-over-blue and monotone khaki-tan with military door star decal, known as the "Patton" staff car.



Moving up a level in detail and price are models made by MATRIX, headquartered in the Netherlands. A fine example is a one-off 1941 Cadillac 60 Special Custom, named the "Duchess", designed by Harley Earl and handcrafted for the Duke and Duchess of Windsor upon their visit to America. Details include chrome plating for bumpers and hardware, dual antennas (one for each radio), royal crests on the rear doors, and the crowning touch of a gold flying lady hood ornament.



The following two Cadillac models are rare and even real ones are seldom seen on the streets. First, the 1976 Cadillac Mirage Sport Wagon below in pearlescent white.



Next, a 1976 Cadillac Fleetwood Castillion Estate Wagon in metallic Chesterfield Brown. Both models share detailed features such as open sunroof, intricate chrome plated grill, vertical hood ornament, period-correct 2" white-wall tires and even a banded, tinted windshield on the Mirage. The conversion was performed by Traditional Coachworks Ltd. of California, as indicated on the plastic case.



Not to be morbid, but professional cars (limos, hearses, ambulances) are collected for many reasons, mostly for their rarity and hand-fabricated bodies. Also, if you really want to be noticed...! The stunning Sable black model of the 1962 Cadillac Miller Meteor Hearse is a work of art. Details include, but are not limited to, intricate plastic chrome plating on the grill, bumpers and accessory hardware, landau bars, textured headlight and taillight lenses, and the proverbial "coffin in the cabin" with window curtains.



The 1966 Cadillac Landau Hearse in authentic Georgian silver and fabric-covered roof included a detailed interior, dash, period-correct dual-stripe white-wall tires, and glass head/taillight lenses. The casket is external to the car, resting on a folding metal stand.



All MATRIX models are limited production and numbered as such. As previously mentioned, they are for the European market, even having the box labeled in 7 languages.

Comparable in quality and price to MATRIX is the manufacturer BOS (Best of Show), focusing on postwar Cadillacs. The crimson red-over-white 1970 Cadillac de Ville convertible is well detailed with chrome plated plastic trim, correct dual-striped white-wall tires, embossed Cadillac emblems, and even woodgrain veneer in the door panels and dash. If you see one of these models, it is best to buy it on the spot as there are few to be found. This 1970 model has been discontinued, making it even more desirable for the collector.



Upping the ante, is the company NEO of Germany. Yes, these models are more expensive, retailing from the low \$100s to upwards of \$500. This 1933 Cadillac Fleetwood All Weather Phaeton is highly detailed, from chrome mirrors, wipers, dual exhaust extensions, to intricate grill design. The model is available in either the top-up or top-down position. This 1933 Fleetwood was a flaunting of wealth in the depths of a great depression, so few of these magnificent cars were actually made.







I am always looking forward to my next future treasure find...one never knows what is just around the corner, but more than likely NOT in a barn!
